Tours

Expert guided tours of Titanic's Dock and Pump-House, inspired by the week when the two completed giants, Olympic and Titanic, met here for the first and last time, are available. These structures, publicly accessible for the first time in a century, are integral parts of her creation and still largely intact. Our tour will give visitors an in-depth understanding of the story of the dock, the people who worked here and discover how such amazing ships were built in a city with no steel.

Special access is given to the Pump-House to view our interactive audio visual display. Be brought back in time to the sights, sounds and smells of the steam-powered pumps and hear the apprentice's story of his first week at work. The tour will trace along the full length of the dock to truly capture the size and scale of the Titanic, and where the caisson gate - over 100 years old - still stands today in perfect condition. Visitors will also view HMS Caroline - the last remaining light cruiser from the First World War.

We are pleased to offer flexible guided tours lasting from 15 minutes to 2 hours to suit different time schedules. Our mini Dock Stop is the ideal stop for morning or afternoon coffee within the beautiful surroundings of Belfast Lough. We can accommodate groups of up to 50 people per tour. We are also happy to arrange tours for smaller special interest groups who may have a specific area of interest, in which case the tour can be personalised to meet your requirements. Educational study groups focusing on areas such as the Titanic, maritime history, technology, science, conservation and regeneration can also be accommodated.

By Air

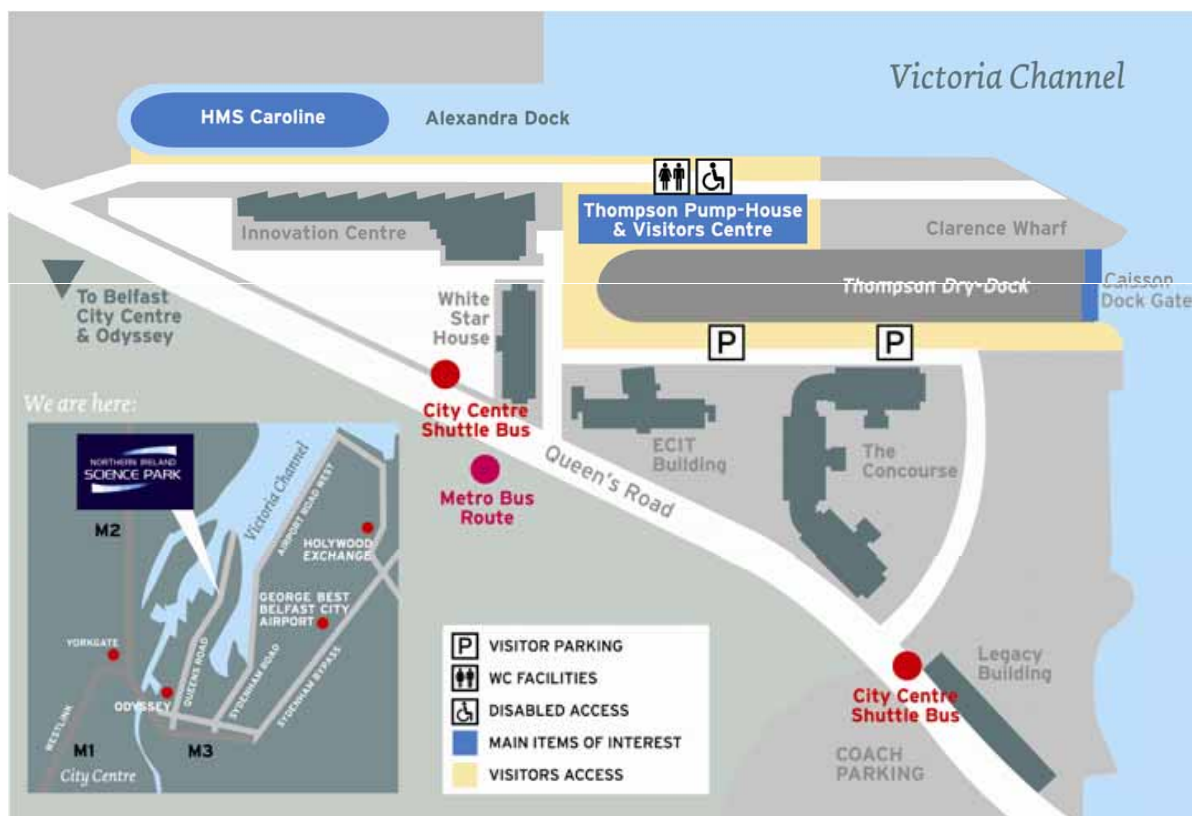
Tourists travelling into Dublin Airport can travel onwards to Belfast on a high-speed rail link in just 2 hours with trains departing every hour.

By Land

Parking

Site access is controlled to the park. Take a ticket at the entrance barrier and present it for validation during your tour to ensure free exit. There is coach parking on Titanic's Dock Drive, take first right after you come through the barriers. All visits include free coach parking and a dedicated guide.
